

IDEAS FROM CONVERSATION (I)

- Importance to take a historical and international perspective to learn from past and current experiences of oppression and resistance
- With a sociology of knowledge approach, reflect on the politics of knowledge, language and academia
- Get inspired by ideas, methods and strategies from action/activist/applied critical schools of thought
- Move away from presenting the current context as a "science vs. Ideology"
 debate highlight the scientific rigor and history of social sciences (for example,
 gender is not an ideology, is a scientifically explained social construction, etc.)

IDEAS FROM CONVERSATION (II)

- Decenter funding as essential to develop research or do impactful social science
- Contribute to the development of alternative databases, archives and conceptual frameworks
- Identify research methodologies that prioritize bottom-up (as opposed to topdown) data collection and knowledge building (including testimonials, oral history, digital humanities, participatory action research, etc.)
- Consider multiple venues to disseminate research findings besides academic journals, think about expected audiences
- Join collective efforts of resistance and creation of better futures strategically
